



BULLET POINTS OF OUR COMMITTEE MEETINGS Summer 2018

- **Brechfa Forest Wind Farm Community Fund**

The Community fund has now opened, £459,200 per annum for the life expectancy of the farm over the next 25 years will be available to local Projects. Llanfynydd will fall into the Regional fund applications as we are out of the 6km catchment area. We will make enquiries into the eligibility criteria, and consider possible uses for the Community Hall Plot. There are 2 funding application forms less than £10,000 and over £10,000. Antur Teifi are the Project Managers.

We discussed the Grant Application process and Action Plan process in particular for the Hall Plot which is currently not used by the Community. We will write to the Community Council requesting copy of the Trust Deed placing the Hall into Trust and subsequent history. Consultation will be required within the Community on any grant project and we discussed various methods of doing this.

- **Llanfynydd Community Website.**

The contract to build a replacement Community Website has been signed between “WeDigMedia” and Llanfynydd Community Council. We attended a Community “informal get together” held at the Pen Y Bont to meet with WeDigMedia, when there was an “Ideas -Session” discussing what the Community would like to be included. We have made our submissions; this includes Photographs of the past, LVS information, links to our Community News and LVS Face Book Pages. There will be the opportunity for business’s to advertise in the Business Directory.

- **Community Wall Hangings**

We have been asked to look into finding the “Legend” of the 3 wall hangings made by the Community, as it would provide information for future years and which can be displayed with each one.

- **Christmas lights in the Village.**

After 4 years we have decided not to erect the Community Christmas lights in the tree by the Lych Gate, this is due to Health and Safety concerns of climbing the tree located in the Church Yard. We have contacted the Community Council to ask if other arrangements could be made.
